		<p><b>Beautiful Day (HT)</b>  A beautiful rose to make beautiful bouquets...it's sure to be a Beautiful Day. Large buds, open into enormous soft apricot blooms with a classic form and a breathtaking fragrance that begs to be brought indoors for enjoyment. Leathery, rich green foliage clothes the long stems that make arranging a dream. Make sure to plant more than one to ensure yourself a large supply of these ravishing roses. Flower Size: 5-6"</p>
		<p><b>Cherry Parfait (GF)</b>  This rose is excellent in all climates. The truly outstanding 4 1/2" cupped blooms the color of creamy white with red edging and the dark foliage make this continually blooming rose a wonderful addition to any garden. 30 petals.</p>
		<p><b>Double Delight (HT)</b>  Beautiful double blooms with an eye-catching color combination. The large, somewhat informal, old-fashioned, 24-30 petals are of rich, cream blushing red. Strong, spicy rose fragrance on a slightly spreading deep green form.</p>
		<p><b>Elle (HT)</b>  The strong fragrance of Elle® combined with the high-centered blossoms, make this a great rose for cutting. The soft multi-colored flowers contrast nicely with the dark shiny foliage. This plant offers above average tolerance to mildew and black spot. The compact growth fits well in small gardens or large containers.</p>
		<p><b>Fragrant Cloud</b>  Large, full blooms of deep orange-red have a fragrance that will knock your socks off. The plant is a shorty and requires an extra shot of fertilizer to get stems long enough to show. The reddish tinted foliage is extremely resistant and persists long enough to give the plant an extra shot of starch that insures hardiness even in cold winter areas.</p>
		<p><b>Garden Party (HT)</b>  Garden Party's stately white blooms with pale yellow undertones, feature a hint of pink that harkens back to its famous parent <u>Peace</u>. Garden Party stands on it own merits as an All American Rose Selection and a perennial favorite of exhibitors and cut flower aficionados. The upright shrub can reach 5 to 6 feet.</p>

	<p><b>Julie Andrews (HT)</b>  About as elegant as its namesake, the rose named after actress Julie Andrews is nothing short of marvelous. Julie Andrews is a compact hybrid tea suitable for containers, and has an upright, bushy growth habit. Fully double, 4"-5" blooms of a deep pink with golden yellow reverse cascade across disease resistant foliage and exude a strong but delicate fragrance.</p>
	<p><b>Mister Lincoln (HT)</b>  A very well-known hybrid tea. Long-pointed buds open into large well-formed, long stemmed, fully double, 4" blooms (petals 24+) of deep red. The velvety texture of the bloom is almost unbelievable. 'Mr. Lincoln' has outstandingly strong damask fragrance that seduces the senses. A vigorous, tall, upright continual blooming bush with dark green foliage.</p>
	<p><b>Moonlight Romantica (HT)</b>  Moonlight Romantica® is a strongly fragrant Hybrid Tea rose boasting large, very full, light-yellow flowers packed with up to 50 petals. Their sweet scent is reminiscent of fresh fruit or honey. Blooming in flushes from Spring to early Fall, the blooms stand out against the lush foliage of dark green semi-glossy leaves, It also has an excellent disease tolerance and is very vigorous on its own roots.</p>
	<p><b>Mother of Pearl (GF)</b>  Even if you sail the seven seas, you'll never find a treasure as lovely as the Mother of Pearl® rose. Presenting clusters of fully double salmon-pink flowers throughout the season. The blooms are about 4 inches across, and the clusters can feature about 4 flowers per stem for maximum cut flower potential. Each blossom releases a light, refreshing fragrance and its medium green foliage is lush and semi-glossy. Mother of Pearl® boasts good health and disease resistance and is particularly robust against black spot.</p>
	<p><b>Princesse Charlene de Monaco (HT)</b>  Princesse Charlene de Monaco® is a very beautiful Romantica® type Hybrid Tea rose. It's very fragrant flowers are fully double and light apricot to shell pink in color. It has excellent disease resistance.</p>
	<p><b>Queen Elizabeth (GF)</b>  This rose has been around for over half a century. It is the first rose classified as a grandiflora. Blooms are a shell pink-picking up salmon shades where the nights are warm. Nearly thornless plants grow quite tall by fall, producing huge candelabras. It's almost impervious to disease. Flowers 4-5". Moderate fragrance.</p>

	<p><b>Raspberry Cupcake (HT)</b>  This special rose has a strong raspberry and lemon fragrance. Its blooms are medium to light pink with large, cuplike petals. It has excellent disease-resistance and will re-bloom throughout the season.</p>
	<p><b>Ring of Fire (HT)</b>  You might fall into a burning Ring of Fire because this rose will bring the heat to your garden! Fiery orange petals are blended with coral and ginger hues to give each bloom the look of a blazing hot fireball. Blooms averaging 4” in diameter. Beautiful matte green foliage and a bushy growth. Classic hybrid tea-shaped blooms stand on tall stems. Mild tea fragrance.</p>
	<p><b>Sweet Mademoiselle (HT)</b>  This variety displays excellent disease resistance for the type with large, full, double blooms that are unique in color. The color can vary with the temperatures, becoming lighter in the heat and deeper, more vibrant pink in cooler temperatures. The blooms are very fragrant.</p>

	<p><b>Cinco de Mayo</b>  This uniquely colorful rose descends from noted award winning roses Julia Child and Topsy Turvy. Large double blooms are a blend of smokey lavender and rusty red. The rounded and bushy plant compliments with glossy green foliage. Blooms resist fading and disease resistance is strong.</p>
	<p><b>Earth Angel</b>  Exceptionally fragrant peony-shaped flowers. Foliage is bright glossy green This old-fashioned rose has an unusual fruity top note: the first impression is of lemon, and sparkles like a fine note of champagne, then presents a hint of elder flower and a discreet top note of ripe raspberries.</p>
	<p><b>Julia Child</b>  Julia loved the butter gold color of this beautiful Floribunda. The perfectly rounded habit of this beautiful plant along with its disease resistance will make this rose a popular choice for gardeners. A wonderful rose to include in any cutting garden.</p>

	<p><b>Mango Veranda</b> This rose is a perfect choice if you need a compact, easily manageable but equally beautiful rose for a small space. Copper-orange flowers with an old-fashioned shape bloom from spring to fall and give off a mild, fruity fragrance.</p>
	<p><b>Moonlight in Paris</b> Enjoy a romantic Moonlight In Paris. This lovely shrub is loaded with romantic blooms that age from deep apricot with a gold center, to a light pink. Moderate, fruity, spice fragrance. The old-fashioned and full (26-40 petals) cupped blooms, flower in small clusters.</p>
	<p><b>Plum Perfect</b> Plum Perfect has numerous, very intensely plum-colored, double flowers. Its old-fashioned blooms flaunt ruffled petals and release a mild, sweet fragrance. The foliage is a healthy and shiny, medium green, and the variety performs well in heat and humidity.</p>
	<p><b>Soul Sister</b> A floriferous Floribunda of divine color! This frilly petaled beauty offers nice 4" ruffled blooms with mild sweet fragrance on a continual blooming bush.</p>
	<p><b>South Africa</b> Glorious, dark golden blooms light up your landscape with glowing amber tones that remain colorfast! People rave about the showy color of these moderately fragrant, double blooms. Each one features up to 25 petals...which makes them a nectar boon to butterflies and beneficial pollinators, too! South Africa Rose bush really stands up to the heat.</p>
	<p><b>Sunsprite</b> Clusters of nicely formed deep yellow blooms are produced in continuous flushes. Packed with an exceptionally sweet licorice fragrance and strong disease resistance. Loaded with lots of glossy deep-green foliage. Far hardier than most yellow roses. Flower size 3-4"</p>

	<p><b>White Lies</b>  The fully double, clustered blooms of <i>White Lies</i> open bright white, which, if you didn't know better, might make you think you have the wrong rose. But as the name implies, the rounded flowers quickly flush to an intense red before finishing completely maroon. Considering the bushy, rounded plants with their glossy green leaves are blooming machines, you'll have plenty to watch on this colorful creation.</p>

	<p><b>Cathedral Bells</b>  Just as the magnificent bells of a cathedral draw people to its doors, so the powerful perfume of this rose will draw you into the garden. Follow the classic, old rose fragrance, with notes of anise and lavender, and you might be surprised at what you find. Appearing in clusters, bubblegum pink buds slowly open to reveal layer upon layer of lilac pink petals, creating blooms with a wonderful, old-fashioned form. The shrub has rich green, disease-resistant foliage. Flower size 3 ½”</p>
	<p><b>Champagne Wishes</b>  Champagne Wishes will have clusters and clusters of soft apricot blooms that fade to white contrasting beautifully with the healthy dark green deciduous foliage. Moderately fragrant.</p>
	<p><b>High Voltage</b>  Yellow blossoms stand tall on sturdy stems making this High Voltage shrub rose an easy resource for cut flowers throughout the season. Long lasting color, a moderately sweet fragrance and clean, disease resistant foliage.</p>
	<p><b>Kardinal</b>  'Kardinal' is a Hybrid Tea rose which produces lightly scented, large cardinal red flowers. In general, roses are a large group of flowering shrubs, most with showy flowers that are single-petalled to fully double-petalled. Leaves are typically medium to dark green, glossy, and ovate, with finely toothed edges</p>

		<p><b>Kashmir</b> Multi-stemmed deciduous shrub with an upright spreading habit. Resembling a hybrid tea rose, the velvety red blossoms are as soft as cashmere. Disease resistant, this shrub rose is an excellent choice as an informal hedge, and perfect for any pot or container. Kashmir roses can take some dry conditions but will not tolerate drought and prefer a moist soil. Winter hardy in zones 4 to 9 and accepting of an urban setting, this rose will survive where most hybrid teas won't.</p>
		<p><b>Limoncello</b> A vigorous grower displaying a profusion of light yellow 3" flowers throughout the season. Dark green foliage to complete the display. Great repeat blooming rose for a large landscape or mass planting. Medium, single 8 petals. Very slight fragrance</p>
		<p><b>Miracle on the Hudson</b> Brilliant red flowers from spring to fall, this red flowering shrub matures in the 3-5' height range. Light fragrance. Winner of the 2014 Biltmore International Rose Trials .</p>
		<p><b>Peppermint Pop</b> The two-toned, pink, and white color of this rose adds a touch of personality and drama. Re-blooms very well from spring through frost. It also maintains a very uniform, tidy habit with the added bonus of being extremely disease resistant.</p>
		<p><b>Pretty Polly Lavender</b> Pretty Polly Lavender has it all, from disease resistance, repeat blooms, sweet fragrance, unique color, and it is even surprisingly easy to care for. This rose is suited for nearly any climate and is hardy down to zone 4. Pastel lavender-pink blooms grace this low growing shrub.</p>
		<p><b>Purple Prince</b> This Shrub Rose has a tough constitution and improved resistance to black spot and powdery mildew. It offers up plenty of double blossoms in a vibrant shade of purple-red. The blooms come in flushes over a long season, no deadheading required. The plants have a bushy, upright and sometimes semi-weeping habit. They reach 3-4' at maturity, making them ideal for low hedges, spots at the edge of a mixed border, and containers.</p>

	<p><b>Raspberry Kiss (Eyes on Me)</b>  The dark raspberry eye provides accent to the creamy pink petals. Extremely fragrant and disease resistance that sets a new rose standard.</p>
	<p><b>Ringo All-Star</b>  The single flower start-off melon-orange with a candy-red eye, then transforms to soft lavender with a pink center. Each flower has five petals and bright yellow stamens, set against handsome, green foliage. Its many attributes include reblooming and being disease resistant and robust. Ringo All-Star™ Rose Rosa x has an upright habit with a height of 34-36 inches. It attracts pollinators. This shrub rose is resistant to powdery mildew and blackspot.</p>
	<p><b>The Fairy</b>  The Fairy Rose, Rosa 'The Fairy', is a shrub rose that has hundreds of small shell pink blooms that appear on a virtually foolproof plant. It has been popular since 1932. The Fairy Rosebush has spreading pyramidal clusters of blooms and has fern-like leaves that are disease proof.</p>
	<p><b>Touch of Pink</b>  Add a little romance to your garden with these roses in the softest pink to nearly white. You'll fall in love with the fragrance, too... it's the classic rose scent we've all been missing in modern roses. The mildew and black spot-resistant foliage is as clean as it comes with roses, and Brindabella Roses™ rebloom every 6 - 8 weeks without deadheading.</p>
	<p><b>White Meidiland</b>  Blooming its heart out, Rosa White Meidiland® is a dwarf, spreading shrub rose which produces abundant clusters of very full, double, pure white flowers, up to 3 in. packed with up to 70 petals. The blossoms have no fragrance and stand out against the lush and beautiful foliage of glossy, dark green leaves. Blooms continuously from late spring until frost, this ground hugging flowering shrub is ideal for banks and rocky areas. Vigorous, hardy, shade tolerant and easy-to-grow, it is also very disease resistant.</p>

## English Roses by David Austin

	<p><b>Benjamin Britten</b>            Strong salmon-pink that changes with age to a particularly strong shade of pure pink. Deeply cupped flowers gradually develop into an open, slightly cupped rosette. Medium height; vigorous, with dense semi-glossy foliage. Ideal for the border or may be grown in a large pot or container. The fragrance is intensely fruity, with aspects of wine and pear drops.</p>
	<p><b>Bathsheba (CL)</b>            Apricot-yellow buds open to shallowly cupped, many petalled rosettes. They are a beautiful blend of subtle apricot-pink and soft yellow, giving the overall impression of apricot, with creamy outer petals. There is a superb floral myrrh fragrance, with hints of honey and Tea. It forms a short, vigorous climber.</p>
	<p><b>Claire Austin</b>            Bears large, cupped, creamy white blooms with a strong fragrance of myrrh, meadowsweet and vanilla. Vigorous and particularly healthy with elegant arching growth.</p>
	<p><b>Darcey Bussell</b>            When young, the outer petals of each bloom form a perfect ring around an inner cup, gradually opening out to form a perfect, medium-large rosette. The color is a deep, rich crimson-pink, taking on a tinge of mauve just before the petals drop. There is a light-medium fruity scent. It forms a compact shrub with attractive bushy growth.</p>
	<p><b>Desdemona</b>            Desdemona is a gorgeous old rose with goblet-shaped blooms of the palest pink that emit a strong <u>almond</u>-lemon fragrance. This bushy shrub rose is ideal for growing at at the middle of borders, close to the front, or alone in a large pot or container.</p>
	<p><b>Gabriel Oak</b>            A magnificent variety, bearing large, many petalled rosette blooms. They are a striking shade of deep pink, the outer petals of each bloom paling slightly over time. The beauty of the blooms is enhanced by a wonderful, strong fruity fragrance. A vigorous rose; it forms a very shapely, broad, rounded shrub with mulberry purple stems and dark green foliage, giving the overall impression of richness and abundance.</p>

		<p><b>Gentle Hermione</b>  Beautiful, pure pink blooms. Particularly resistant to rain. There is a strong, classic, Old Rose scent. Attractive, healthy growth.</p>
		<p><b>Golden Celebration</b>  Magnificent, cupped, golden yellow blooms. Delicious tea scent with hints of Sauternes wine and strawberry. An award-winning variety: in every way an excellent garden plant.</p>
		<p><b>James Galway</b>  With its vigorous, upright growth it makes a wonderful climber in a short time. The strikingly beautiful flowers are mid pink at the center, gradually becoming lighter towards the edges. The numerous, neatly placed petals in each bloom create a slightly domed shape.</p>
		<p><b>Lady of Shalott</b>  Rich orange-red buds open to chalice-shaped blooms, filled with loosely arranged, orange petals. The surrounding outer petals are salmon-pink with beautifully contrasting golden-yellow undersides. There is a pleasant, warm Tea fragrance, with hints of spiced apple and cloves. It quickly forms a bushy shrub with slightly arching stems and mid-green leaves, which have attractive, slightly bronzed tones when young.</p>
		<p><b>Olivia Rose</b>  Bears beautiful, cupped, mid pink rosettes, with a delicate fruity fragrance. It commences flowering exceptionally early in the season and flowers in flushes until well into the fall. It forms a very healthy, well-balanced shrub with dark green foliage, which shows off the flowers to the very best effect.</p>
		<p><b>Princess Alexandra of Kent</b>  The unusually large, bright pink flowers are full-petalled and deeply cupped. In spite of their size, they are never clumsy, being held nicely poised on a well-rounded shrub. There is a strong and delicious fresh Tea fragrance, which changes to lemon, eventually taking on hints of blackcurrants.</p>
		<p><b>Roald Dahl</b>  Soft orange-red buds open to medium-sized, cupped rosettes of perfect apricot coloring. They are extremely robust and have a lovely fruity Tea scent. Very healthy; it matures into an attractive, rounded, bushy shrub with few thorns.</p>

		<p><b>Silas Marner</b> Soft mid pink, the petals are pale on the reverse and fade at the edges. Held on red stems, the medium-sized cupped blooms have relaxed, almost ruffled petals which are set around an attractive button eye. There is a medium-strong Old Rose fragrance with accents of fruity lemon, green banana, and apricot. A very healthy medium-sized shrub with glossy dark green foliage and wide, arching growth.</p>
		<p><b>St. Swithum</b> A short, vigorous climber bearing large, saucer-like blooms, each packed with over one hundred frilly petals. They are a pure soft pink, paling to blush towards the edges, and are complemented by plentiful greyish-green foliage. There is a medium-strong myrrh scent.</p>
		<p><b>Teasing Georgia</b> A yellow 4-5" rose (petals 50+) of delicate beauty. The flowers are of a particularly pleasing cupped formation. The center petals are in the form of a rich deep yellow while the outer petals fall back and fade to pale yellow, providing a most pleasing two-tone effect on a continual blooming bush. A pleasant tea rose fragrance.</p>
		<p><b>The Generous Gardener</b> Bears beautifully formed flowers, which nod gracefully on the stem. When the petals open, they expose numerous stamens, providing an almost water lily-like effect. The flowers are a pale glowing pink and have a delicious fragrance with aspects of Old Rose, musk, and myrrh.</p>
		<p><b>The Poet's Wife</b> Bears rich yellow flowers, which pale over time. Their formation is most pleasing, having a neat outer ring of petals enclosing an informal group of petals within. There is a strong, wonderfully rich fragrance with a hint of lemon, which becomes sweeter and stronger with age. It forms a bushy, nicely rounded shrub with arching branches and rather shiny foliage.</p>
		<p><b>Thomas á Becket</b> A rose of similar character to the Species Roses, with natural, shrubby growth. The informal rosette flowers are a striking crimson-red. Held in medium-large sized heads, they nod attractively on their stems. The Old Rose fragrance has a distinct lemon zest character.</p>
		<p><b>Windermere</b> The blooms start as perfectly rounded buds, opening to full, cupped flowers that are rich creamy yellow at first, fading to almost pure white in the sun. They have a delicious fruity fragrance that has a definite hint of citrus. Very healthy; it forms a neat, compact plant, even in warmer areas.</p>

		<b>Climbers</b>
		<p><b>Cherry Frost</b> Cherry Frost™ is a solid, cane hardy, <b>zone 4 rose</b> with beautiful clusters of smaller red blooms. Climbing rose of superior disease resistance. From spring until frost, she puts on a stunning display with flushes of small, beautiful clusters of cherry red blooms. You will not be disappointed by this distinguishable red, super bloomer!</p>
		<p><b>Florentina</b> This moderate sized climber produces large clusters of clear red blooms that have a wonderful old fashioned, cupped appearance and a slight scent. Good repeat flowering with soft, easy trainable canes that have very few thorns. The shiny foliage is extremely disease resistant and tolerant of heat.</p>
		<p><b>Garden Sun</b> Instantly brighten your garden with the cheerful, apricot flowers of Garden Sun climbing rose. This romantic, long-blooming rose flowers for over five months, lasting from early summer through frost! This rose is especially disease resistant and easy to grow.</p>
		<p><b>Highwire Flyer</b> Highwire Flyer™ has a very strong, vibrant color with excellent resistance to black spot, rust and mildew. Abundant and continuous, electric, hot pink blooms will make a statement in any garden.</p>
		<p><b>Raspberry Cream Twirl</b> The large, very full, cuplike blooms offer a deep pink with white stripes and emit a light apple fragrance. This robust plant grows to be 10-12' tall and 4-5' wide and has medium, glossy, dark green foliage that is dense and leathery. Its excellent resistance to diseases and it is almost thornless</p>
		<p><b>Tangerine Skies</b> This high and mighty climber will be a beacon of light in any garden! Reaching heights up to 8 feet tall, Tangerine Skies™ Arborose® is an outstanding choice for tall arbors or trellises. The blooms it produces are a peachy mango blend and sit beautifully against glossy, dark green foliage. In addition, this Kordes® rose is incredibly resistant against common diseases.</p>
